

**Summer 2011 Institutes in Washington, DC
Full Scholarships Available for Students from the Slovak Republic
Extended Deadline - February 11, 2011**

The Fund for American Studies has scholarships available for students from the Slovak Republic to attend one of the four summer institutes offered in Washington, DC.

Washington, DC Programs

Each of the four Institutes in Washington enable students to get a firsthand look at the American system of government by living, learning and interning in Washington for eight weeks.

The following Institutes will be held from June 5 - July 30, 2011 at Georgetown University in Washington, DC:

- **Engalitcheff Institute on Comparative Political and Economic Systems (ICPES):** For students interested in economics, government and international affairs
- **Institute on Political Journalism (IPJ):** For students interested in journalism or communications
- **Institute on Business and Government Affairs (IBGA):** For students interested in how business influences government and the political process
- **Institute on Philanthropy and Voluntary Service (IPVS):** For students interested in nongovernmental organizations or civil society

Students live and study at Georgetown University, and hold internships for approximately 30 hours per week. Experts in journalism, business, public policy and the nonprofit sector engage students in weekly dialogues held both at Georgetown and at locations such as the World Bank and Capitol Hill.

Scholarship and Application Information

Several scholarships are available through the generous support of The Friends of Slovakia and the Slovak American Enterprise Fund. Full scholarship funding covers tuition and housing, but does not cover meals, personal expenses and transportation to and from the United States.

All students must complete the online application available at www.DCinternships.org and follow the specific application instructions for international students. The application deadline for Slovak students has been extended until **February 11, 2011**.
